Charlotte's wish to have a camper will allow her to experience the freedoms of childhood, while providing a safe and comfortable environment to meet her medical needs away from home.

You see, unlike many teens her age, Kimora has been diagnosed with a heart condition and imagining herself as the heroine in her favorite stories helps her persevere through her daily challenges, restrictions, and hospital stays.

Russell is a spirited six-year-old boy from Mercer County who loves to run around with his friends, ride his bike, and play Donkey Kong. When he is at home, he enjoys building his LEGO sets and watching movies with his family, especially his current favorite, The Good Dinosaur.
